Brian Parker



Brian Parker Retires as Chief of the Fire after 20+ Years

Northeast Georgia Council Recognizes Brian Parker on his Retirement

On Sunday, October 11, 2020, the Northeast Georgia Council congratulated long-time Council Director of Support Services Brian Parker, on the occasion of his retirement from the Council after 28 years as a Commissioned Professional Scouter. Brian Parker joined the ranks of professional scouting in the Northwest Georgia Council in Rome in 1992. In 1995, he transferred to the Northeast Georgia Council, serving in the position of Senior District Executive, later District Director, in the old Alcovy District (Gwinnett County). In 1999, Brian became the Council Program Director and began 22 years of service as director of Properties and Camping operations throughout the council, including Summer Camps at Rainey Mountain and Scoutland. That same year, Brian assumed the role of Chief of the Fire (Council Staff Adviser) of Mowogo Lodge #243, a role he held until his retirement at the end of September.

For his many years of service, Brian was recognized for having held the role of Chief of the Fire longer than any previous adviser.

At the reception on Sunday October 11th, the Executive Board of the Northeast Georgia Council presented Brian with the honor of permanently renaming the loop round around camp as the "PARKER LOOP".

Former Lodge Chief and former Council President Dr. Trevor Hooper read the declaration and presented a beautiful sign that will be placed at the four-way fork near the Herring Trading Company.

In addition, Rusty Royston, Mowogo Lodge Adviser, presented Brian with one of three rocking chairs being placed in his honor. "One goes to Rainey Mountain on whichever porch you choose, one goes Scoutland – there's only one porch there, and one to go on your own front porch", said Royston.

Trip Selman, Scout Executive and Supreme Chief of the Fire, presented Brian a framed antique map of Camp Rainey Mountain (circa 1974) from the archives of the BSA National Engineering Group.

Brian is an Eagle Scout from Charleston, SC, a Vigil Honor Member, and a Wood Badge Trained Scouter (SR-87, NW GA Council, 1995).

Again, Mowogo Lodge congratulates Brian Parker on his 30 years of service to Scouting and 25 years with the Northeast Georgia Council. As Trip Selman closed his remarks, "Brian, now you get to come work at camp for free."

Phil Nichols was born in Richmond, Virginia but grew up the majority of his life in Lawrenceville, GA. Phil is a product of the scouting program in the Northeast Georgia Council. His dad took him to sign up at Walnut Grove Elementary School in the fall of 1996. He has been registered in the Northeast Georgia Council in some way ever since that day. He obtained the Rank of Eagle Scout in December 2007 with Troop 56 out of the First United Methodist Church of Lawrenceville. From 2006-2012 Phil served on the Camp Rainey Mountain Summer camp staff serving in leadership roles including Nature Lodge Director, Commissioner and Program Director. He also served as Camp Director at Scoutland Adventure Camp from 2014-2017. He is a Brotherhood member of the Order of the Arrow.

Phil Nichols was Field Director of the Northeast Georgia Council Boy Scouts of America. He has served the scouts in the Apalachee and Sweetwater Districts from March 2018-August 2020. Previously he served the scouts in Chattahoochee as both a District Executive and District Director from August 2012-March 2018. Phil was promoted to the position of Council Program Director in August of this year and we welcome him as our new "Chief of the Fire" for Mowogo Lodge and look forward to his leadership and support as Mowogo continues to grow and thrive.

These patches will not be mailed but are available for pickup at the next function you attend.














Mowogo History

Trading Post


