FINDING THE ARROW (Scouting is a head fake)

When I first became a young scout, I fell in love with all things scouting. It started simple enough; learning how to start a one-match-fire, how to pick a dry campsite, how to properly tie a knot, and how to hike in the woods.

I later learned that while these things are very important, they are not the end-aim of our movement. I have found that there are some in scouting that stop their understanding of scouting with learning these "scouting" tasks. Their judgment of what makes a "true scout" is based upon how well a boy, or a man, can tie knots, pick campsites, wear a uniform, start a fire, and in general perform what we think are these "scouting tasks". I am here to tell you that they are wrong.

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the death of Rudyard Kipling. If you have spent any time in scouting at all, your life has been touched by Kipling. You may know him as the author of "Jungle Book" on which our Cub Scouting program is based. (The Jungle Book was written 122 years ago and yet Disney published it again last month!). Kipling's fingerprints are all over scouting. My scoutmaster often had us playing "Kim's Game" in our meetings. Maybe you've played it. What I didn't know back then was that "Kim" was the main character in a Kipling book, or that the game was actually recreating Kim's British secret agent training.

Scouting is what I like to call "One big head fake". But unlike in basketball, scouting's head fake doesn't make you go the wrong way; it makes you go the right way.

In the OA we talk a great deal about, "The true meaning of the Arrow". For us to be what we need to be we must look for and find what is truly important. Those scouting tasks and skills that we strive to be able to perform ARE important, and they may even save your life one day. But if you don't know and understand the Admonition, you will lose your life.

I've asked Cy to publish a poem in the Arrowpoints if there is room. If he doesn't find room, then I challenge you to find, read, and reflect upon it. It is simply titled - "IF". It was written as a tribute to a man named Jameson who, coincidentally, served in the Boer Wars with one we all know and love, Col. Robert Stephenson Smyth Baden-Powell.

I think the poem fairly well lays out what "finding the arrow" is all about. I hope it will encourage you.




