

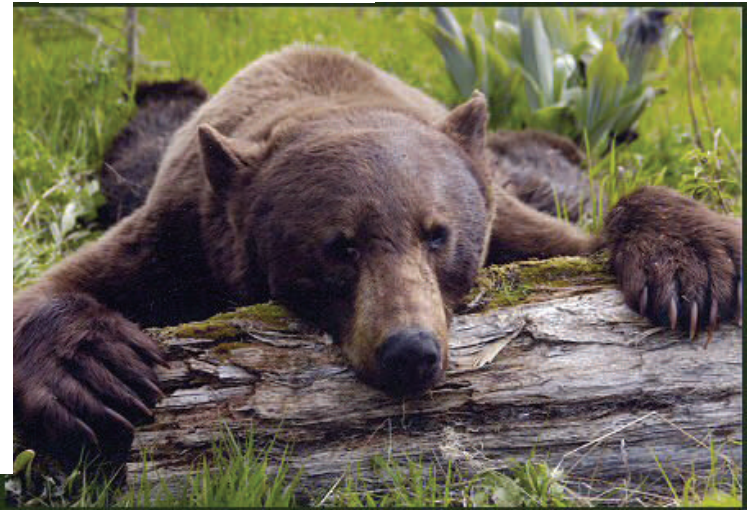

Also, I am looking for any materials from pervious conclaves held at Rainey Mountain. This conclave represents the 50th anniversary of the first Conclave

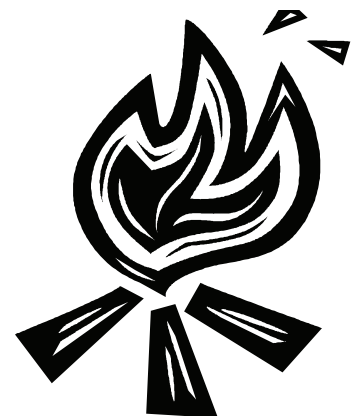

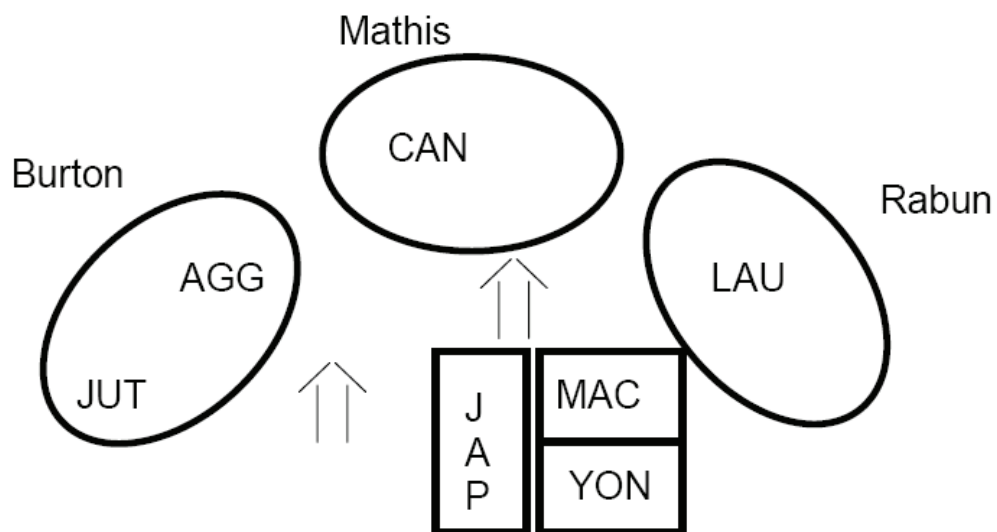
