Scouts can join the ceremonies team, playing an important role in bringing traditions to life during Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil ceremonies; learn traditional Native American dances like Grass Dance and Fancy Dance, which are integral to lodge events; or train in drumming, the heartbeat of many ceremonies.
